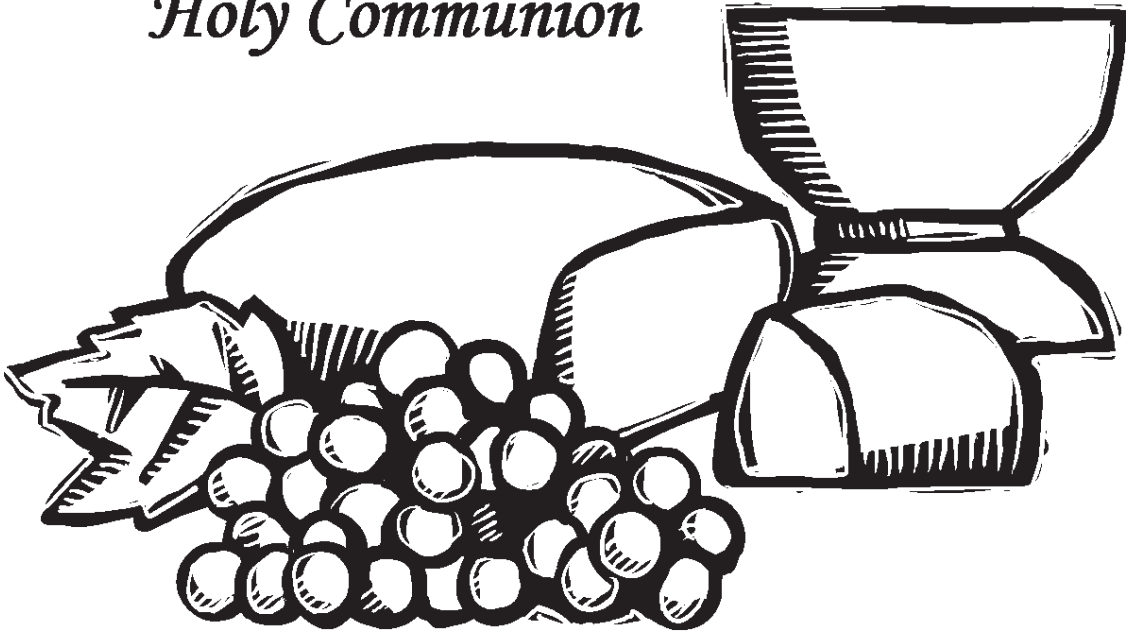

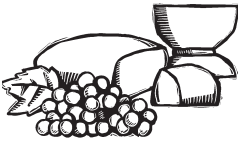

Finance Report —Bill Ashworth, Chair

Through the first four months of this year FUMCOR expenses exceeded income by only \$1,075, or in other words we just about broke even. This is favorable to what was expected and slightly favorable to last year for this same period. Facilities income (rents) and preschool cost share were the largest positive factors.

Of concern as we look at the balance of 2009 are capital expenditures and repairs. For example our sound system for the sanctuary which has served us well for many years is being replaced at a cost of almost \$30,000. This amount is not yet included in our year to date results. The Trustees have been faithful in keeping our aging facilities well maintained and this has been a real blessing. Still, major expenses can be expected to continue over time--think of having about 20 older homes to maintain.

We know the economy has been a major concern for our members. While pledged giving to date has been good, the special Easter offerings were significantly below last year. Also some of the rental incomes are being lowered as tenants are struggling with their finances.

We will continue to keep you informed of our financial situation as the year progresses and please keep our church in your prayers.
