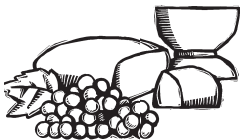

## UMCOR Responds to Philippines Typhoon

The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) Philippines is working with its local partners to provide relief to those affected by Typhoon Ketsana, also called Ondoy. According to the National Disaster Coordination Council (NDCC) nearly half a million people are affected. Hours of heavy rain and high winds caused flashfloods and landslides. Many people are confirmed dead.

Over the weekend, the government declared a "state of calamity" in Manila and the 25 storm-hit provinces. The BBC reports that 80% of Manila is underwater, displacing 450,000 people.

UMCOR is in the beginning stages of assessing the damage and will work quickly to understand the situation and respond where needed.

UMCOR Philippines will begin immediate relief activities with the distribution of emergency provisions including bottled water, blankets canned fish and rice.

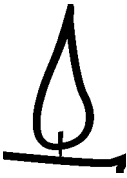

## UMCOR Responds to Philippines Typhoon

The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) Philippines is working with its local partners to provide relief to those affected by Typhoon Ketsana, also called Ondoy. According to the National Disaster Coordination Council (NDCC) nearly half a million people are affected. Hours of heavy rain and high winds caused flashfloods and landslides. Many people are confirmed dead.

Over the weekend, the government declared a "state of calamity" in Manila and the 25 storm-hit provinces. The BBC reports that 80% of Manila is underwater, displacing 450,000 people.

UMCOR is in the beginning stages of assessing the damage and will work quickly to understand the situation and respond where needed.

UMCOR Philippines will begin immediate relief activities with the distribution of emergency provisions including bottled water, blankets canned fish and rice.

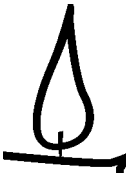
