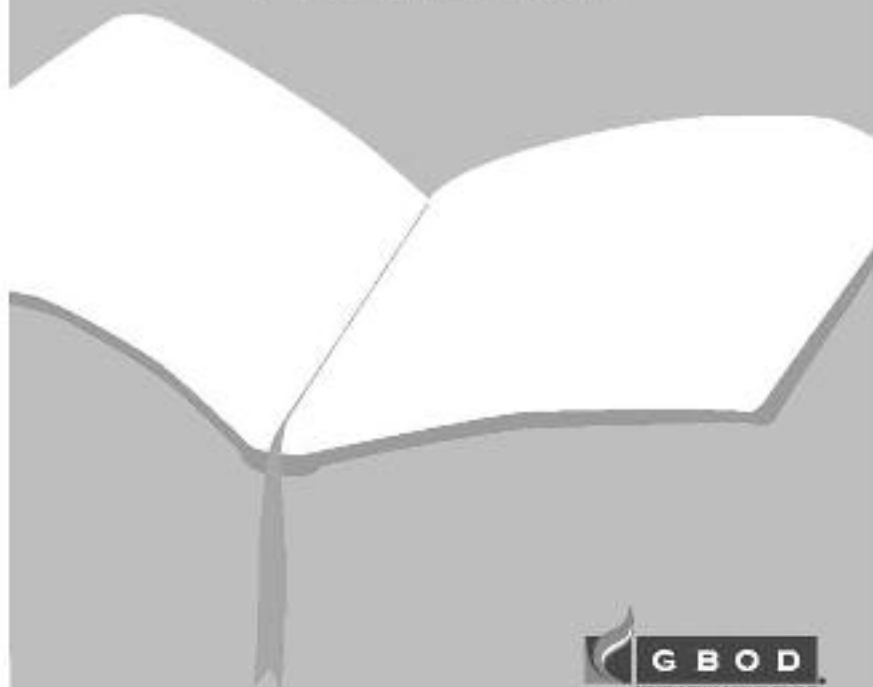

Our 2011 stewardship campaign, "Round-up Ranch" continues and the pledges are rolling in. Thank you to all who have returned your pledge cards. We are grateful for your current contributions and your pledges of continuous support of the ministries of our church.

Our 2011 budget is not yet finalized, but is anticipated to be around \$600,000. We have stated a pledge goal of \$450,000, with the other \$150,000 to be made up through other revenue sources. As of this writing, we have attained about 30% of that goal.

Six hundred thousand dollars is a lot of money, and you may wonder what sort of expenses go into a budget of this size. Below, we've created a summary of FUMCOR's largest expenses.

Salaries / Health Insurance / Pensions: \$180K. Our church has several wonderful employees helping to fulfill our missions. They include our pastor, youth and family directors, choir and bell choir directors, our organist, office employees, childcare workers and an associate pastor who we'd like to bring in next year.

Housing and Auto Allowances: \$49K. Both our senior and associate pastors are given housing and auto

allowances.

Janitorial and Gardening: \$75K. These contractors both do an excellent job of keeping our buildings and grounds clean and beautiful.

Utilities & Trash: \$38K.

Apportionments: \$70K. These are required payments to the conference.

Other Admin Expenses: \$69K. These include insurance, telephone, supplies, maintenance costs, etc.

The remainder leaves small budgets for education and mission work, as well as any miscellaneous expenses not addressed above.

As you can see, it takes a significant amount of money to keep our church running smoothly. We've calculated an average pledge of \$150 per household to meet our goals. Obviously, some will pledge more, and others will be unable to pledge at all. We ask all who have not yet done so, to carefully evaluate your financial situations, pray for guidance and return your cards as soon as possible. Any gift, whether it be in the form of financial support, prayer, presence or service is gratefully received by the members of our church.
