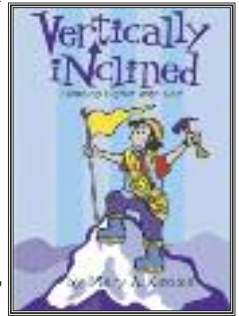
Sisters Bible Study
