Children Workers Policy Update

According to FUMCOR's policy, it is the responsibility of the Sunday School Superintendent to make sure all records are current and correct for all Sunday school teachers and assistants. To keep us in compliance with the Safe Sanctuary policies of our church and conference, we need to have two adults (18 or older) in each classroom. We can still have older children or youth assist, but they do not replace the second adult. All adults working with children will have on file a signed "Screening Form for Supervisors of Children and Youth", a "Statement of Receipt, Understanding and Agreement of the *Child Abuse Prevention Policy at FUMCOR*", and the "Voluntary Emergency Form". These files will be located in the Sunday School Superintendent's office.

In reviewing our current staff, all current Sunday

school teachers and leaders will be asked to do some paperwork to get us fully in compliance. Some people who have never been fingerprinted will be asked to do this as soon as possible. The necessary paperwork for fingerprinting at our local police station can be picked up at the office between 8 AM and 4 PM Monday to Friday. Barbara Bush will monitor those receiving the paperwork, and Pastor John will keep all result records (confidential) in his office.

Currently, we need to have four more adults to bring us in compliance. Please pray and think about helping us fill these very important needs. We also need substitute teachers and assistants. 

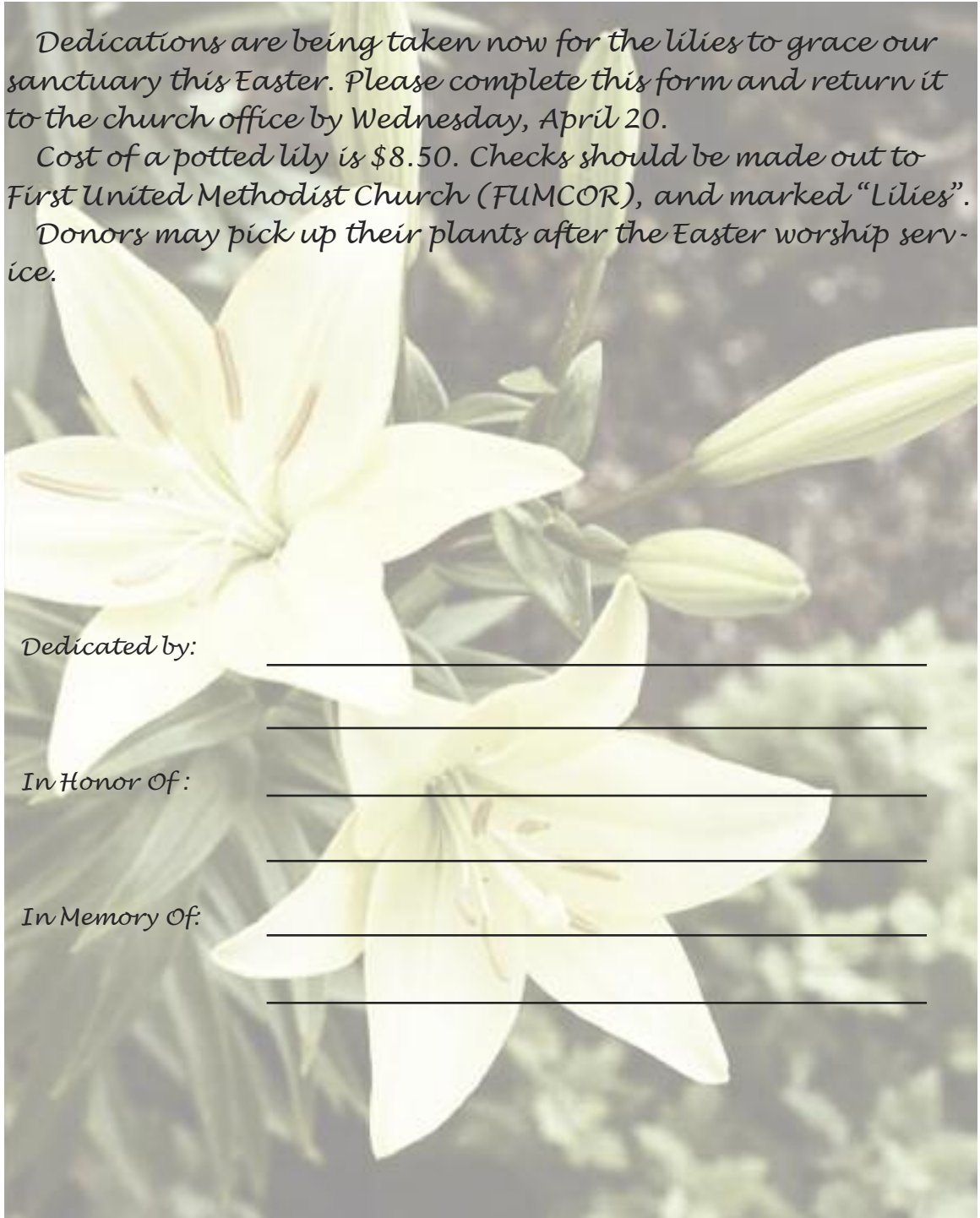

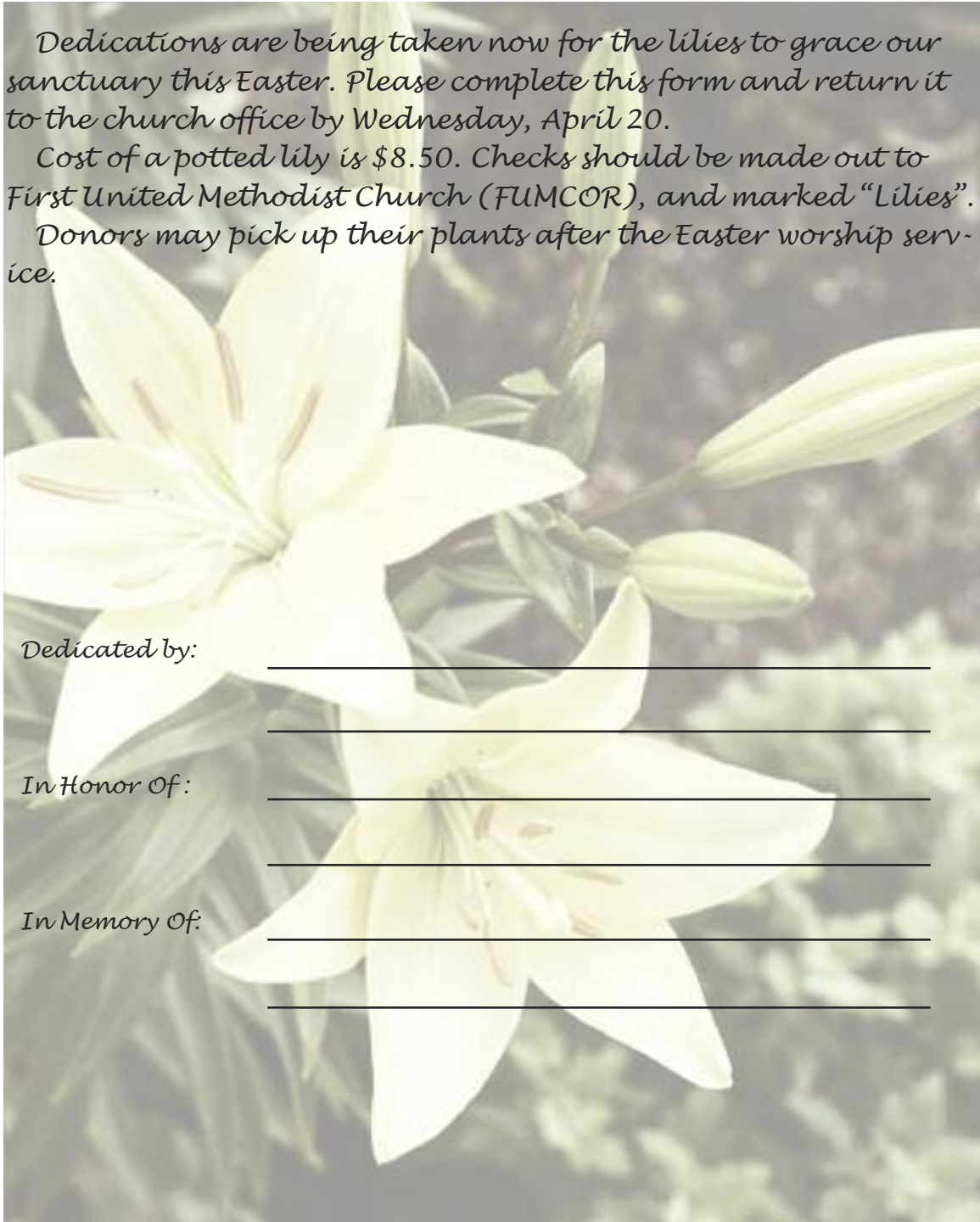
