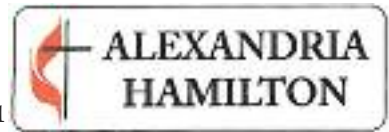

## Finance Corner

Following is a quick glance at the church's finances for year-end 2010 and year-to-date 2011.

We ended 2010 far better than we anticipated.

Reasons: the church paid no salary for an associate pastor for the last six months of the year, received better than expected income from rents and the Preschool cost share, and benefitted from some improvement in the market.

The results for January 2011 should be examined cautiously. The Cal-Pac Conference has not yet begun billing for our annual apportionments, so we can expect to pay for both

January and February at about the same time, and then monthly thereafter. Also, Pastor John and the SPRC are expected to address, soon, the matter of an associate pastor and the accompanying salary package.

If you have any questions regarding the financial statement shown here, feel free to speak to any member of the Finance Committee, or better yet, attend the monthly Church Council meetings (fourth Monday of each month, 7:00 PM in the Adult Lounge—next meeting is February 28) and participate in the discussions.

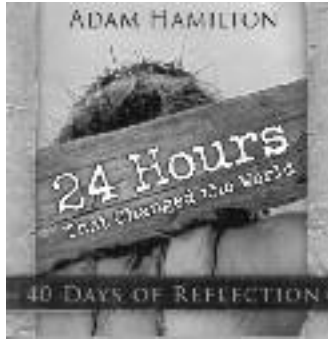

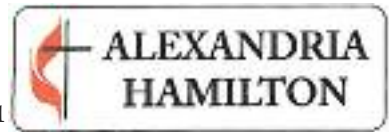
During our Lenten soup and program, we will watch the DVD presentation and study together. There will also be a music program.

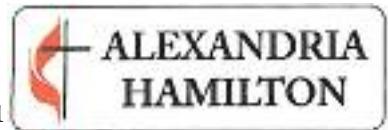

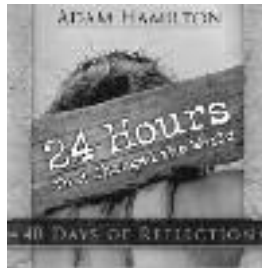
*24 Hours That Changed the World* can be purchased on the patio following the worship service today or on March 6, or in the church office. Cost is \$7. Pastor John has included a

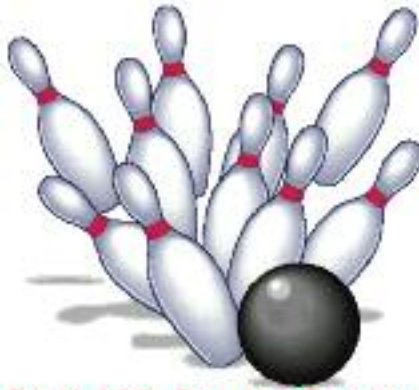
