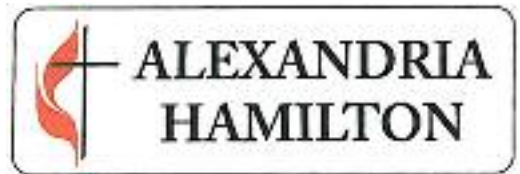

Be sure to watch for our choir members, Kris Lovekin and Laurie Williams, who will be part of the 21-voice nuns' chorus.

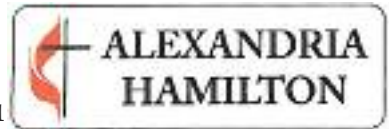

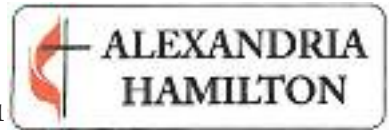
