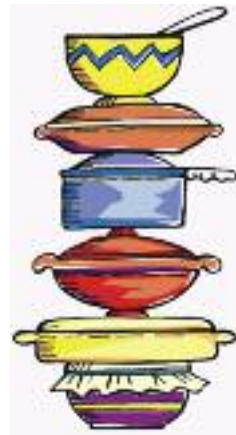

"Build It Up" 2012 Stewardship Campaign

Tithing: Where Does The Money Go? What Happens If We Don't Make It?

When my boys were little, they were so fascinated by the change machine inside the arcade. Every time they put in \$1.00, four quarters came rushing down to the bottom. They enjoyed the idea of giving something and then getting something more in return. I use this anecdote because when we tithe, the Lord always gives us back more.



In Malachi 3:10, God gives us a promise about tithing and what blessings we will get in return. It states, *"Bring the entire tenth to the storerooms in my temple. Then there will be plenty of food.
